# Message from the Chairperson

Dear Members / Friends,

I am pleased and exhilarated with the continued growth of The Zigen Fund as it now reaches 18 years old. It is timely that I have been able to spend an uninterrupted amount of time this past year in China to focus on Zigen's organizational and program development matters. I thank you for your trust and support for our achievements so far and look forward to your trusting involvement as we step up to new challenges.



With projects in more than 200 villages and monitored by 20 local coordinators, Zigen is evolving to better achieve our vision to create opportunities for rural villagers in China to acquire knowledge, skills and creativity to realize their own potential. We are now able to tackle more fundamental development challenges with our established grassroots network and growing organizational strengths. Here I wish to share what I saw on one of my visits to Guizhou which reinforced my commitment to focus on human-centered sustainable development activities.

With improved roads, I traveled to the remote village of Maoping in the shortest time ever, especially compared to my first trip of more than 20 hours from Guiyang. I felt very happy and moved to see: Yang Xiao Lan, a Zigen scholarship recipient, who is now the first and only female teacher in Maoping Primary School; Yang Junfen, the first female paramedic in the village; numerous Zigen supported junior high school graduates who are now productive members of the community; and others who had worked as laborers in the cities and returning to Maoping after making meager money. And, of course, the beautiful setting with many happy faces of children and teachers is unforgettable. It is heartwarming to see the happiness, contentment and difficulties of the people, and I feel fortunate that The Zigen Fund has helped them improve access to more education which ultimately leads to more fulfilled lives.

It is important to note that the PRC government announced that it will provide free, compulsory education from Grade 1 to 9. However, the implementation of this policy is still in process. For instance, we have found as many as one-third of the village schools in which we are involved have not received any funds for the past two years. Therefore we continue to support student's scholarships for these schools until government funding is in place.

In closing, I hope you are as proud as I am with what we have achieved so far. As Zigen now reaches 'legal age', when in many countries people are accountable for their actions, I am striving to increase Zigen's impact by leveraging our achievements in selected projects and villages to advocate for long-term government policy and funding support in the future.

# **Zigen's Initiatives**

To meet the constantly evolving conditions and needs of rural China, Zigen has initiated the development of a number of programs in 2005. Some of these programs have been launched already, while some are still in the planning stages. The following is a brief introduction to these initiatives:

## 1. Quality School Education: to increase depth and scope of learning

Zigen is planning new programs to improve the quality of education, which will achieve more far-reaching objectives as compared to Zigen's past programs which focused on access to education (scholarships) and provision of basic school equipment (hardware). These programs include:

- Teachers Training Pilot Program to develop a rural teachers training manual with emphasis on participatory teaching philosophy and teaching methods.
- ESL training program to improve skills of rural junior high school English teachers.
- Professional development programs and conferences to provide continued education for rural village teachers.
- Extra-curriculum programs to promote local culture -- such as arts, music, and craftsmanship -- that complement core academic subjects mandated by the Education Bureau which are academic and city oriented.
- Student and Teachers exchange programs to enable rural teachers and students to produce more creative lesson plans and gain international exposure from visitors.

# 2. Vocational Training Programs: to build opportunities and effectiveness

Zigen is aiming to create a "Zigen Training & Implementation Center" that will offer short training programs that not only teach new skills, but also ensure new behaviors and systems are implemented and sustained. The distinguishing feature of the Zigen's training programs is that each participant will receive follow-on support, start-up kits (as well as appropriate seed funding), networking groups and/or conferences, and access to information resources.

The target participants and subjects of these programs are:

- Village leaders, especially women, on ethics, social responsibility, and community organizational skills.
- Villagers on improving their farming methods, marketing knowledge and accounting skills.
- Secondary school graduates on skills that enhance their employment potential.
- School principals and teachers on participatory teaching methods, extracurricular designs and local culture awareness.
- Village medics on experiences sharing and formation of a supporting network,
- Village women on household management, accounting skills, nursing, and basic knowledge of health and nutrition.
- Village entrepreneurs to organize and offer eco-tourism businesses

# 3. Health Care Education & Start-up Kit: to improve provision of medical care

Lack of quality medics and affordable medicine are common problems in most rural villages in China. Zigen will attempt to address this critical issue by increasing support in rural health programs that include education and follow-on implementation assistance. Programs being considered include:

- Scholarships for paramedics to enroll in professional medical programs to obtain village medics licenses.
- Collaboration with Beijing University of Chinese Medicine to develop training programs for village medics in acupuncture, massage, and herbal medicine.
- Provision of basic medical equipment.
- Support network and regular conferences to share practices and disseminate lessons learned to other medical care providers in villages.

# 4. Support for Beijing Migrant Workers' Children: to obtain adequate education

Due to lack of government services available to the enormous migrant workers population in Beijing, many migrant workers' children do not receive adequate education. Zigen is planning to fund various projects to increase education opportunities, such as visiting museums, and to improve school facilities, such as kitchens, for migrant workers' children.

# 5. Operational Effectiveness of The Zigen Fund: to impact society positively

Zigen has numerous talented and committed persons in Beijing, Guizhou, Yunnan, Shanxi, Henan, and Hebei. With a growing network of volunteer and paid staff, Zigen will review its operational and organizational structure, with particular focus on building a tighter and more efficient operational base in China. Furthermore, Zigen will undertake more promotion and fundraising activities such as:

- Conference for villagers, academics and NGOs
- Partnership with universities and research institutions
- Funding arrangement with organizations and corporations
- Eco- and cultural awareness tours

# **Developing Communities through Nourishing Roots**

Enduring hardship over the years has dampened the sense of community in most of the remote villages. Enjoyment of local native culture and heritage slowly gave way to emulation of city lifestyle and values. In 2005, Zigen dedicated more efforts to support the revitalization and strengthening of local culture and to restore the dignity and pride of their community.

#### 1. SCHOOL EDUCATION

#### A. Scholarship

School education in villages brings the literate younger generation heightened awareness of the dire circumstances in their homeland. Zigen maintains contact with these developing adolescents and as they leave their villages for junior high school education.

# B. School Facility Improvement and School Life Enhancement

In addition to granting new school facilities and teaching equipment, Zigen encourages villages to adapt traditional facilities for updated and community use.





In Qeniao Village, the school moved to a new cement campus (left). Zigen funded the relocation of the old school house (right) to the new campus for use as a dormitory and student activity facilities.

## C. School Curriculum Enhancement

To preserve local heritage, Zigen funded classes taught by village elders to pass on their knowledge that they learned from their ancestors.

## D. School Teaching Enhancement

Zigen funded three teacher training programs in 2005. All programs will be extant for the next few years in designated communities in QingLong, Hebei and in the Southwest minority regions in Guizhou and Yunnan.

#### 2. ADULT EDUCATION

A large number of migrant workers in the garbage-recycling industry are self-employed laborers or business operators who face unusual risks and difficulties such as exposure to hazardous pollutants or toxins, cutthroat competition between businesses and discrimination from society. Towards the end of 2005, Zigen approved funding for a pilot project initiating capacity-building of migrant workers in the Beijing district garbage-recycling industry.

#### 3. VILLAGE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

They were rural development enthusiasts who had already spent months volunteering in rural villages. Two of them, Li Guangdui and Feng Yi have since become full-time staff of Zigen.


Without our dedicated staff in China, we would not have been able to reach beyond basic education projects.

# **Grants Statistics**

# 1. Project Grants Summary

Total grant increased 34% to \$395,053 in 2005. Investment in education remains our main stay in 2005 with 77% of grants applied to school education. We have, at the same time, increased support to adult education and rural community development, including project R&D monitoring and administration.




#### 2. Basic Education Grants Distribution

2005 School Education Grant Distribution of \$305,654




# 3. Scholarship Breakdown by Type of School

Zigen's scholarship program includes school fees and book subsidies for primary and junior high school students. For senior high school, vocational high school, college and university students, scholarship provides tuition. As the central government enforces free compulsory education up to junior high school, Zigen will shift its resources to support more post junior high school education, especially vocational high school education.
