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Message from the Chairperson

Dear Members/Friends,

In the fall of 2007, I visited the Miao villages Maoping, Queniao in the midst of mountains and village Zhuanjiao situated in the heart of yellow plateau. In the past twenty years, Zigen has supported children's schooling in these villages as well as the basic infrastructure and services in some of the villages. Each year, striking cumulative changes can be seen. The children supported by Zigen have grown up; we have seen their bright

faces grow from childhood to adulthood, and felt how they have cherished the chance to study.

Upon graduating from school, they either work in the cities as hired laborers, or stay at home to farm, but their efforts and aspirations for improving their home villages never change. Maoping Village's Yang Changhua had been working at the front desk of a hotel in the county town since graduating from middle school.

When I met her the year before, she told me, "I want to continue studying. If I have passed the high school exams, will Zigen support me?"

I told her that Zigen had a high school and university scholarship program. This year I unexpectedly met her in the village, and she had become a kindergarten teacher in Maoping Village. With a radiant and beautiful smile on her face, she creatively improvised a lively learning environment for the children.

"I want to try my best to teach these children. I wish greatly to learn more teaching methods and to become a better teacher."

In Queniao Village (Sparrow Village), I met students who had gone to work in Guangzhou for 3 years after graduating from junior high school. They told me: "Home is still better. Outside is too difficult." Wu Hao, with his three other classmates, established a cooperative group to initiate the production and sale of peppers, and was elected as the head of village. He had many plans for the development: "I wish to make my hometown into a green and beautiful place. I want the villagers to have the opportunity to learn more agriculture technology, marketing, environmental protection and health maintenance. The villagers must collectively work for our home village's development."

Through the years, thousands of Zigen supported students had graduated from junior high school, vocational school and college. Some becomes hired laborers in cities, while some stay in their village to open their own businesses or to become peasants. Despite their eager desire to build their villages, they have more to learn and practice before realizing their dream. We start to see the trend of our graduates returning to home villages from the cities. In the past three years, Zigen has gradually expanded its scholarship for girls to integrated development of villages. Right now, Zigen is supporting 12 villages with integrated programs in education, health, environment, cultural and community building.

All these and upcoming incremental progress cannot be achieved without your continued contributions in various kinds. We appreciate your partnership! We celebrate with you on all we have achieved and look forward to more in the future!

Program Evolution

Executive Summary

Since 2006, due to Chinese government's implementation of providing free education in rural areas of China, Zigen has adapted its programs and priorities in order to fit with this historical circumstance, continuing to strive to strengthen the villages from within, guided by Zigen's mission of promoting grassroots development in rural China. There were three significant changes in Zigen's program as described below:

(1) Giving financial aid for student living expenses

China started in 2003 to gradually implement free education which provides school fees and textbooks for the nine-year compulsory education. This policy change is impacting Zigen's past long-standing emphasis for -- scholarships to girls to enable them to go to school. Our program also covered orphans and children from family in severe situations, of single parenthood or sick parent.

It has been widely accepted that the new free education policy has benefited many students. However, in recent years, after much investigation in Shanxi, Hebei and Guizhou, we realized that the government, in implementing the policy, is in fact closing many village schools, obliging students to attend regional center schools. Children as young as first and second graders have to walk long hours and to live in dormitories, or peasants' homes at a cost of 1500 RMB per year for room and board. The cost is six times greater than that of their neighborhood village schools. The high living expense places a tremendous burden on families living in poverty. Consequently, Zigen has closed the girl's scholarship program, and started to give financial aid to the poverty stricken students boarding at schools.

(2) Integrated, sustainable village development

Over the years, thousands of Zigen supported students have graduated. Some of them have left their villages but have sent money back to support parents and village development. Others have stayed in their village to work as farmers, teachers, paramedics or to form small agriculture cooperatives. They are the most active elements in their village development. Realizing that they now constitute a great resource for rural development, Zigen has re-adjusted priorities from supporting scholarship towards supporting integrated sustainable village development. In cooperation with Zigen graduates, Zigen has identified 15 villages in Guizhou, Hebei and Shanxi where school education, adult education, primary health care, local cultural preservation and environmental protection programs are supported. In addition to funding environmentally appropriate technologies such as biogas, energy-conserving stoves, and forestation programs, Zigen has put emphasis on supporting environmental education in the schools and villages.

(3) Rural leadership training programs

To develop integrated, sustainable programs in villages which need dedicated and capable village personnel, Zigen has collaborated with universities and local institutions to develop training programs for potential leaders in village development including teachers, village leaders, and, especially, women leaders.

Below is a more descriptive outline of the transition undergone by Zigen in this historical period of great change in China. We listed some highlights in each project category—School Education, Adult Education, Healthcare, Rural Community Development, Project Research and Development, Public Education, Administration and General.

I. School Education

Increased subsidy to more dormitory students with higher living expenses is necessitated by the government’s “Closing and Merging School Policy” (撤点并校). In addition, Zigen has given teacher subsidies, basic school equipment and scholarships so the students can continue going to school close to their home.

I-A. Scholarship

There were some adjustments to the program based on local situations.

- Number of scholarships for university and vocational college students was increased from 87 last year to 158 this year. Some of these college students have received Zigen scholarships since they were in first grade and have participated in volunteer work either in Zigen supported programs or in college student community service programs.
- Zigen has supported projects in Shilou County, Shanxi for many years. Several Zigen supported village schools are facing severe budget cuts, if there is no school near by, children in very young age have to walk several hours to the center school.
- The number of Beijing migrant children scholarship was increased from 81 to 110 in 11 schools which have no government support.
- Scholarship for the 9-year compulsory education was increased from 100K to 150K, with total number of student supported reduced from 5512 in 2006 to 4456 this year.

I-B. School Facility and Equipment Improvement

Every year, Zigen received numerous applications from the schools in Zigen-supported villages. Many of the schools don’t have basic school equipments and adequate infrastructures. Given limited funding, Zigen can only support small number of the applications.

- Zigen has provided funding to build clean drinking water systems for children at two primary schools in Hubei.
- A biogas system was installed at the CaiDian Center School in Hubei to provide classroom electricity.
- Funding for toilets, school access road improvements, dormitory facilities, and sports equipment were also provided.

- Zigen continues to give nutritious lunch supplements to two primary schools in QingLong, Hebei.
- In QingLong, Hebei, Zigen has funded installation of an irrigation system in the Agriculture Education Center, where Zigen has also provided 30 to 50 scholarships for needy students in the past 3 years.

I-C. School Curriculum Enhancement

- In collaboration with Zigen Taiwan member Professor Huang DeBei, Zigen supported a 'Drawing with Crayon' in seven migrant worker children schools in Beijing and in Zigen-supported village schools in Hebei, Shanxi and Guizhou provinces. For the first time, the students use color crayons for drawing. Before the program, students can only afford to use regular pen and pencil for drawing.
- The “Books of Love” program, was initiated and supported by Sanquan Fund. The program features include rotating the use of books among groups of schools; teachers lead the students to read as a group and jointly discuss contents of the book. More than 30 schools in Sichuan, Hubei, and migrant workers’ children schools in Beijing have joined the program. Zigen funded the purchase of books and Zigen staffs have helped organize volunteers to lead the students to read and write in schools for the migrant workers’ children.
- Zigen supported 6 school libraries in QingLong, Hebei and in ChangPing, Beijing. In addition to gifting books, the program facilitated the development of school library management practices in each school. Daxindian village opened the library to its villagers and managed the library with participation of villagers and teachers. Gehetou adopted the library corner setup in each classroom and allowed core teachers and students to team up and read or borrow at will. Dongzhangzi elected to let the teachers implement book circulation method.
- Students residing in the dormitory have inadequate food. Zigen has supported a school vegetable garden program. Teachers and students working together grow the vegetables in school vegetable garden. Students learn scientific farming and supplement their food supply with the produce of their work. The Wangfeng Middle School in Leishan, Guizhou, the vegetable and fish farming program was a major success with a bountiful harvest. Zigen provided funding for seeds, and basic farming tools.
- Many school enrichment programs were initialized by the teachers, including a student run broadcasting program started in Queniao school, Leishan county in which the students are responsible for scheduling, content and operating of broadcasting programs. Funding for basic broadcasting equipment was provided by Zigen.
- A local cultural enrichment program was in its fifth year (singing of local songs, dancing, drawing, and embroidery work in school). In December, six participating schools held a conference in which more than 300 grassroots teachers participated to share the experiences. Zigen has supported the funding for the basic program materials and the local artists to teach the program.

I-D. Teaching Enhancement

Zigen continued to support substitute teachers teaching in remote villages, as well as supporting continued professional training at county training institute.

II. Adult Education

Zigen has coordinated with universities and local institutions to develop training programs to provide training to those who will play a leading role in village development including teachers, village leaders, especially women leaders, and college students who are interested in rural development.

II-A. College Rural Volunteer Program

8 college students spent 10 months in Zigen-supported villages. Students joined Zigen project coordinators to investigate the local needs, and to evaluate the effectiveness of Zigen supported projects. Participating students joined a 4 days training session, the primary goals of the training are to learn basic research methods, to understand some of the urgent issues in the rural villages; and to develop a value of respect and responsibility to their rural counterparts.

II-B. Village Adult Training Program in Collaboration with Ministry of Education

After Junior High, small numbers of the graduates continue to go to high school and hopefully to college. Majority of the graduates either stay in the village doing the farming work, or go to cities working as hire labors. Those that stay in the villages, are eager to improve their farming methods, hygiene, and environment protection knowledge. In collaboration with Department of Vocational and Adult Education of Ministry of Education in China, Zigen supported a pilot training program to organize agricultural training sessions in Qinglong County. Zigen provided funding for the training, and Zigen staffs joined the development and organization of the training sessions.

II-C. Developing Rural Teachers Training Manual

The fourth English Teacher's Training program took place in Leishan, Guizhou in collaboration with the Qiandongnan CPPCC¹ Rural Support Unit. The second and third phases of Rural teachers' training program were to be held in Southwest University. The objective of the program is to develop a teachers training manual to train the rural teachers.

II-D. Safety and Hazard Training for Migrant Workers in Garbage & Recycling Field

Zigen continues its pilot program in training on safety and environmental issues that migrant workers face in their jobs and lack of necessary knowledge about to protect themselves. Raising environmental awareness and expanding related knowledge through training and practical projects is integrated in our sustainable rural development approach.

The pilot program of training and community activities for migrant workers in garbage and recycling field has been sponsored by David and Katherine Moore Family Foundation since 2006. The program helps Zigen gain the learning experience on program development combining training, community activities and specific issues.

III. Health Care

Zigen continues to support paramedics training in Taijiang and Leishan counties, Guizhou, for them to qualify for the county paramedic certificate. \$13,000 for medical supplies was granted to 106 villages in these counties.

The local governments endeavored to fund building the village clinics. Hence, Zigen took a strategic move to support supplies and devices as well as software in clinic, and may match government funding in clinic building if needed.

IV. Village and Migrant Worker Community Development

IV-A. Rural Community Development

Zigen local partners are increasingly active in taking initiatives of building their villages as more and more young graduates become contributing members in the villages.

A grant for inter-village farming co-ops has been provided to the Farming Technology Society in Leishan, and the chicken farm project in Jiaoxiong and Queniao has been successful. Jiaoxiong Village was very successful in supplying eggs and chicks for the townspeople; Queniao -situated in much harsher environment - suffered some losses at the beginning of the year, but received technical and financial support from the Jiaoxiong chicken farmers.

IV-B. Urban migrant worker community development

Zigen's pilot program in Beijing Migrant Worker's center has produced inspiring results. The migrant worker's center in Beijing, has provided a space for migrant workers' children and their parents to receive homework assistance, after-school care, extra-curricular activities, community events and competitions, socials, environmental education and practices. The favorite events include summer camps, crayon drawing, compositions, children's journalism, Chinese chess competitions, weekend movie nights, children drama class, etc.

V. Project Research and Development

Zigen's Project Research and Development programs provide the information necessary for Zigen Board and staff to better understand the local needs and as to what works and what doesn't, to facilitate project designing and methodology. Such information has helped us make the shift from girl's scholarship to more community-based education and training projects and sustainable village development model initiatives.

VI. Public Education

In supporting programs in rural China, we realized that there are many urgent needs and issues that need to be addressed, including the need for broader public attention. Zigen will allocate more funding to investigate the current situation, to support programs, and to share the good practices and lessons learned. Zigen will put more efforts in improving zigen websites, newsletters, seminars, and multi-media presentations.

Zigen received special funding earmarked for producing two documentary films respectively about rural education (in Shanxi) and rural health care (in Guizhou). The films will be used in public events for raising public awareness of the challenges and efforts made in the underprivileged rural areas of China.

VII. Administration and General

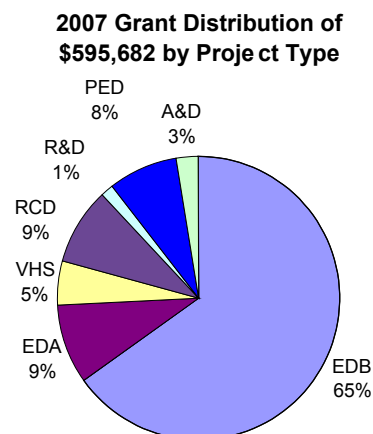
China Zigen Rural Education and Development Association (China Zigen) has been our collaborative partner in implementing and monitoring projects in China. As Zigen's project funding increases, there is a significant need for capacity building in both U.S. Zigen and China Zigen to better identify, design, implement and evaluate our projects. The organizational infrastructure is crucial for ensuring our projects are sustainable in the long run. Administrative costs are still significantly low and more funding will be allocated to the database and accounting system, communication platforms, and organizational development.

Grants Statistics

I. Project Grants Summary

Total grants in 2007 totaled \$595,682 (including \$9,708 disbursed in U.S.) increased 43% from 2006. Investment in education remains our main stay in 2007 with 65% of grants applied to school education, 9% Adult Education and 8% Public Education, totaling 82%.

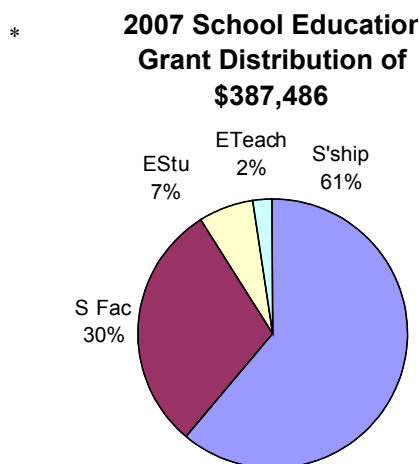


II. School Education Grants Distribution

As China's Government implements new policy for compulsory education in rural areas, many village schools were closed and students have to go to township center schools. Such a change often led to significant financial hardship for poor families due to high transportation and boarding cost. Zigen significantly increased curriculum-enhancement project funding to improve students' school learning and life quality. Teachers' training projects have been re-categorized in Adult Education.

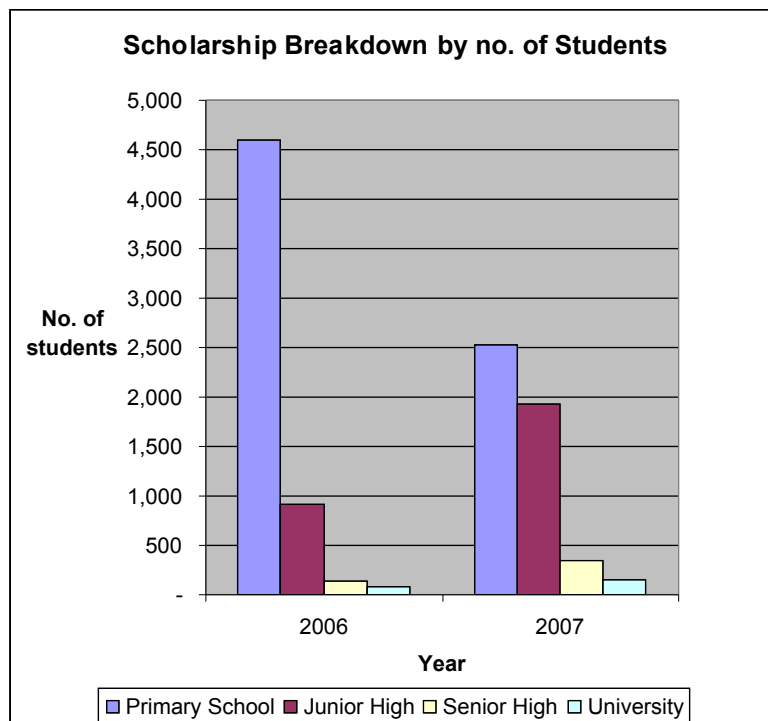
Teachers Training grants in 2007 is re-categorized in Adult Education.



III. Scholarship Breakdown by Type of School

Zigen’s scholarship program includes school fees, book subsidies and living subsidies for primary and junior high school students. For senior high school, vocational high school, college and university students, scholarship provides tuition and living subsidies. As the central government enforces free compulsory education up to junior high school, Zigen is shifting its resources to support more post junior high school education, especially vocational high school education; there is a shift from primary school scholarships towards support to junior high and beyond.

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The Zigen Fund promotes human-centered sustainable development, registered as a 501(C)3 nonprofit organization in the U.S. In 1988. A sister organization, China Zigen Association for Rural Education and Development, is a registered nonprofit in China. The two cooperate to support grassroots efforts of the impoverished people for life improvement and sustainable local development.

Zigen support projects in (1) basic school education; (2) adult education; (3) rural community development (basic health care, environmentally sound technologies and small-scale cultural and economic development).

The characteristics of Zigen's projects include: (1) focus on the people in the poor and remote areas, emphasizing basic needs; (2) encourage local participation and initiatives, aiming to develop local capacity; (3) fund small and manageable projects (\$200-\$10000), result-oriented and duplicable.

Since 1988, Zigen accomplished effective projects in 265 villages, 45 counties and 11 provinces, mainly in Guizhou, Yunan, Guangxi, Hubei, Sichuan, Hebei, Shanxi, and the migrant workers' communities in Beijing. To date, Zigen had provided more than 80,000 scholarships for girls and orphans to go to school; supported school and village libraries, literacy classes, women health workshops, village clinics, household biogas and small hydro power station. As the government started to implement free compulsory education in China, Zigen continues to support more projects in enhancing quality school education, promoting adult education, access to basic health care, and other rural development areas.
