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2009 Annual Report Message from the President



Dear Friends,

It has been my great pleasure to serve Zigen as the President and as a board director. In eight years, Zigen has more than quadrupled its revenue from 160K to 750K. Not only are we able to sustain the scholarship and school programs that we have developed since 1988, your continued support has made it possible for Zigen to allocate more resources to achieve our goal. Currently our work is focused on integrated village development and the migrant workers' activity center.

Village Community, Integrated Development

Twenty years have passed, and Zigen is supporting education, health, culture and environmental improvement in over 200 poor villages located in 9 provinces of China. In over 50 of these villages, Zigen is supporting the full enrollment of girls in primary school, middle school and high school. Among them, many have been admitted to universities, and some have graduated, some have gone to work in the city, and others have launched their careers in their home villages. The girls of twenty years ago are the women of today, and are the main force in the development of their villages and communities.

Migrant Worker Activity Centers

Employment opportunities in cities are attracting job-seekers from villages. These cities, unprepared for the influx of migrant workers, are without community facilities to accommodate the social needs of their new labor force. Zigen sees this need and has established community activities centers, where migrant workers, far from home, family and friends, can enjoy social contact and support from those more experienced.

We are able to engage a good number of university students and expatriate professionals to help with maintaining dynamic programs for learning enrichment. To reap maximum benefit from the efforts of our valuable volunteers, we need to hire capable full-time managers to coordinate these efforts. Your continued support in developing those programs at our pilot locations is vital.

Looking ahead, we shall continue to face 2 major challenges:

1. Global recession has significantly reduced the amount of philanthropic donations;
2. RMB exchange rate has not been in our favor in the past few years and is expected to worsen in the next few years.

However, with our strong commitment to help those in need, and with your generous support, we shall do our best to keep all the on-going programs going forward.

Program Evolution

Executive Summary

In year 2009 Zigen celebrated its twentieth anniversary by greatly extending its previous achievement through grassroots development programs. Zigen members, staffs, volunteers and supporters all take advantage of this occasion to reflect on Zigen's legacy in promoting sustainable human development in rural China through people-to-people help in the past twenty years. In 2009, we have re-emphasized Zigen's focus on education as basic human needs, and continued and expanded the scholarship support programs in elementary, middle, high schools and the college level. In consistence with Zigen's principles of creating long term community partnership and building local capabilities for sustainable development, our project team has made every effort in consolidating our existing projects at the village level in all of our regional project bases, and in strengthening trust and links between Zigen and the villagers. Our project staff tries to reach out to specific rural focus groups, such as village women, the elderly, village children, migrant workers, etc., in order to promote their basic needs and collective welfare in health, environment, and continued education. Indeed, by the twentieth year of Zigen's endeavor of advancing China's rural education and development, we have developed a flexible system of programs and projects that adapts to China's diverse rural conditions and the fast changing socio-economic situations.

(1) Supporting basic needs in education, focusing on the most disadvantaged

Zigen's continued financial support for the most disadvantaged rural children to stay in school has proven essential for the fulfillment of the rights in basic education of the rural population, even six years after the implementation of a nationwide policy of providing free basic education in China's rural communities. Despite the cancellation of tuitions and fees, Chinese rural students continued to face severe financial and psychological problems in crowded boarding schools and crammed classrooms. The continued policy of geographically concentrating schools in big urban centers has serious negative effect for poor peasant families in remote rural communities, burdening them with extra cost of transportation, room and board at distant schools in which their children may have to live starting at an early age of six. Zigen's scholarship program targeting orphans and children from families of severe hardships play a key role in their ability to stay in school and finish the nine-year compulsory education phase. Financial aid programs beyond the nine-year compulsory phase at the high school, vocational school and college level also proved to be necessary and universally welcomed. Scholarship and schooling related financial aid category represents 39% of all projects spending in 2009 (\$260,708 out of \$665,990). In addition to financial aid, Zigen continues to support a variety of school programs providing classroom and dorm facilities, dietary nutrition, and extra-curricular activities. Notably, we have introduced for the first time school activity that tended the mental needs of students, especially those of female students. School education projects other than scholarship accounts for 26% of all 2009 project spending (\$175,326 out of \$665,990).

(2) Planning for the sustainability of rural communities

As the first groups of students who had been helped by Zigen entered their adulthood, their rural communities have also undergone enormous changes during the last twenty years. While enormous wealth has been created in China, its rural population has paid a dear cost in terms of deterioration of public services, socio-economic inequality, environmental degradation, rural exodus and family dislocation. In 2009, Zigen targeted these problems by identifying urgent needs, planning effective intervention measures, encouraging grassroots participation, and implementing community based projects. In 2009, Zigen has a total of \$27,287 in spending in the category of rural community development. While continuing to build our health programs (totaling \$28,617) and adult education programs (totaling \$10,386) serving the rural population, we have made a great stride in supporting innovative environment-friendly energy projects in rural schools.

(3) Helping, communicating and working together with focus groups

From the very start of Zigen's conception twenty years ago, we have in mind rural women as our primary

focus group. As we understand rural villages better through long term grassroots work and cooperation with various rural stakeholders, we have identified several other focus groups that play an essential role in the future development of China's countryside. In recent years, Zigen has made major efforts to supporting capability building and other aid programs for village women, rural leaders, and returning migrant workers. We have also replicated in most project sites cultural programs for elderly villagers who constitute by now a major portion of village population. Indigenous and local cultures, such as traditional dance, nationality embroidery, local theater, etc., have been a major theme in these focus group projects, as cultural pride is believed to be a major element of revitalization of China's rural villages. For those peasants who choose to find livelihood in the urban centers, Zigen also continued and expanded its migrant worker programs, by opening the Xisanqi service center this year, which has been enthusiastically welcomed by local migrant workers and families.

Including project management and operating cost, Zigen in 2009 spent \$665,990 on a diverse and systematic ensemble of projects and programs in rural education and development in the underdeveloped area in China. A more detailed synopsis of this effort in aid and advocacy during this twentieth anniversary year is in order. Major project spending categories will be highlighted, including school education, adult education, healthcare, rural and migrant worker community service and development, project research and development, public education, administration and general.

I. School Education

Scholarship

Scholarship in the forms of direct money transfer was offered to 2503 students in total, in the amount of \$260,708 in the school year 2009/2010. Categorical and regional breakdowns and detail explanations follow.

- Among the 2770 students receiving support, 49% are primary students, 23% secondary students, 21% high school and vocational school students, and 6% college students. In terms of amount of spending, primary and secondary scholarship accounted for 40% of all scholarship spending.
- Regional wise, Sichuan province became the biggest destination of scholarship funding in 2009, which received \$65,410 (or 28.7% of total scholarship spending), while Guizhou remained the province with the largest number of student recipients (549 students, or 21.9% of all supported students).
- The number of university and three-year college students receiving Zigen scholarship for 2009 is 114, a decrease of 29% from that of 2008. Volunteer work and public service activities and education for the student recipients continue to be a major component of the university scholarship program.

- In 2009, scholarship for the 9-year compulsory education levels is \$91,500 for 1374 student recipients. The figure for the past year is \$150,000 for 2615 student recipients. That means we have again increased the amount of support on a per student basis, as we did last year, mostly to help students in centrally located boarding schools to cover living and traveling costs.
- We continue to support primary and secondary students in schools for migrant children in Beijing, for a total of 187 students (a slight decrease from last year's 199), in a dozen of schools in Beijing suburbs, which still lack sufficient public funding.

School Facility and Living Condition Improvement

In the past several years, rural students became more and more concentrated in centrally located boarding schools, which usually lacked adequate facilities of dining, living and heating in the winter for students. On the other hand, those village schools that remained open had even less resources allocated to them for classroom repair and renovation, or basic teaching and physical education equipments. In answering requests from these rural schools, Zigen supported various school facility and living condition improvement projects.

- Seven different school facility improvement projects were implemented in primary and secondary schools in Shanxi province, ranging from classroom rebuilding to improvement of dietary nutrition for school meals.
- School facility projects in Guizhou province focused on providing dormitory beds and beddings in rural boarding schools.
- Projects providing physical education and teaching equipments, books, library accessories, desks and chairs were implemented in Hubei, Shanxi, Sichuan rural schools, and migrant children's schools in Beijing.
- Improvement in school facilities and living conditions were accomplished through innovative projects that were energy saving and environmentally friendly. School projects with a both a life quality improvement and environmental sensibility will be summarized below in the "healthcare and environment" section.

Reading Program and Secondary Curriculum

Zigen has always advocated content relevance and orientation toward local and practical knowledge in rural schools, and has development various curriculum enrichment projects. This year, Zigen continued to implement innovative curriculum enrichment projects at the grassroots levels. Project spending in this category for 2009 amounts to \$10,512.

- Built upon its original conception in Taiwan, the "Library of Love" expanded in many of Zigen's project areas. This year, the past installation of libraries were further refined and corroborated in Beijing, and Hebei, Sichuan and Hubei.
- In Shanxi province, Zigen supported a local textbook creation for Shilong township, with a general theme on the Yellow River, which flows by near the Shilong township. Another "second curriculum" project was implemented in the Vocational School for the Hearing-impaired in Luliang City, Shanxi.
- Zigen supported classes in local art in one secondary school and three primary schools in Gehetou township, Hebei province.

Capability Building for Rural Teachers

Zigen put an emphasis on capability building of teachers who are the grassroots level of rural basic education. With our accumulated knowledge and experience, we were able to implemented English teachers training for rural teachers in two different counties, each in Shanxi and Hebei provinces, totaling \$3,874 in project spending. Zigen also provided stipend subsidies for seven rural teachers in Hanjiashan Central School, who endure special hardship and difficulties.



II. Adult Education



Zigen advocates the important role of adult education and life-long learning for the human centered, sustainable development of rural China, and continues to be committed to the development of innovative and relevant interventions and programs. For several years, Zigen has been consulting various academic and local experts and institutions in order to develop training programs for rural leaders and other focus groups, such as women, migrant workers, the elderly, and youth interested in rural

development. By developing partnerships at the both the grassroots and central government levels, we strike to promote the long term goal of life-long education and learning for rural residents and advocate appropriate models from both national and local perspectives. Project spending in the adult education category totaled \$28,617, or 4.3% of total project spending of all categories.

- In 2009, our adult education project has been concentrated in Hebei province, where we cooperated with the Education Bureau of the Qinglong county government in implementing projects that supplied equipments and learning materials for rural adult education centers, training sessions for rural technical and consumer know-how, and research meetings for adult education workers and experts. A total of \$11,000 was spent on the seven different adult education projects in Qinglong, Hebei province.
- In 2009, Zigen again collaborated with the Department of Vocational and Adult Education of Ministry of Education in China, this time in sponsoring a project in "award of excellent and exemplary individuals and cases and special topic research (农村成人教育表彰先进典型和专题研究)." Zigen has agreed to sponsor this high-profile, central government organized project as it has an impact of national scale.

III. Healthcare and Environment

Accessible healthcare in the village and an environment that provides the necessary natural resources for the current and future generations of the villagers remains to be on the short list of human basic needs deemed essential by Zigen. In 2009, we implemented several healthcare and environment related projects in our project villages, in cooperation with villagers and local institutions and authorities. Healthcare projects accounted for 2% (\$10,386) of total project spending, while environment projects accounted for 14.0% (\$89,973). The healthcare and environment projects include:

- "Delivery of Health to Schools and Villages" with service and consciousness raising in six boarding schools in Qingling County, Hebei province.
- School bio-gas complex in six Qinglong primary schools and secondary schools.
- General environment protection projects in two Shanxi secondary schools
- Infrastructures building for a solar-energy bathroom and toilet in Liguang Complete Primary School in Yulong County, Yunan province.
- Environment protection handbook compilation in Shilou County, Shanxi.
- Solar energy bath house building in Paotong Second Secondary School in Huangpo District, Wuhan, Hubei province.
- Solar energy heating system building in Xinji Primary School, Xinzhou District, Wuhan, Hubei province.

IV. Rural Community and Migrant Worker Community Development

In 2009, Zigen funded a variety of village based community development and empowerment projects, many with a cultural and environment component. Our local partners, usually the village committee and sometimes local associations took active part in developing, implementing and managing the projects, with significant participation by village women. Likewise, in Beijing's northern suburbs, a new community activity center was set up in Xisanqi, serving the migrant workers' community. Grants for community development totaled \$27,287, or 4% of total project spending. That means in 2009 the rural community and migrant worker community development category becomes the second largest project category after school education.

An illustrative sample of these community development projects:

- Energy-saving stove for a total of 240 rural families in two townships of Leishan County, Guizhou province.
- A village library in Weizhuang, Lankao County, Henan province.
- Family Bio-gas in five villages in Qinglong County, Hebei province.
- Support of village Yangge dance team in Tianjiacha Village, Shilou County, Shanxi province.
- Support of Yangge dance team for senior citizens in Shilou County, Shanxi province.
- Women's embroidery development in Leishan County, Guizhou province.
- Microfinance for villager's start-up business in Majiang County, Guizhou province.
- Water storage in Caochang Village, Qinglong County, Hebei province.
- A book corner in a Beijing migrant workers community, in cooperation with the local organization, Tongxin Hope Home.

V. Project Research and Development

To improve project quality and information feedback, Zigen staff went to great length in collecting information, evaluating local needs, analyzing problems and searching for effective and efficient solutions. These research activities have been carried out either in conjunction with regular projects, or implemented as independent research projects with Zigen's allocated research fund. In 2009, Zigen staff carried out several field researches in Beijing, Hebei, Guizhou and Shanxi. A dedicated research project on village environment on environmental education was carried out in Qinglong County, Hebei province, in cooperation with Qinglong's official Environmental Protection Bureau, Health Bureau, and China Agricultural University.

VI. Public Education

With twenty-year's work in grassroots work in human development and empowerment, Zigen has always been active in the effort of advocacy, addressing urgent issues and participating in public debate in the area of rural education and development.

- In 2009, Zigen has made a major rework of its official website, drastically increasing the amount of information and the frequency of updating.
- Zigen has organized several showings of Zigen related films, including Sparrow Village, and No Fifth Grade in university campuses, followed by featured talk by Zigen organizers.

I. Donation Summary

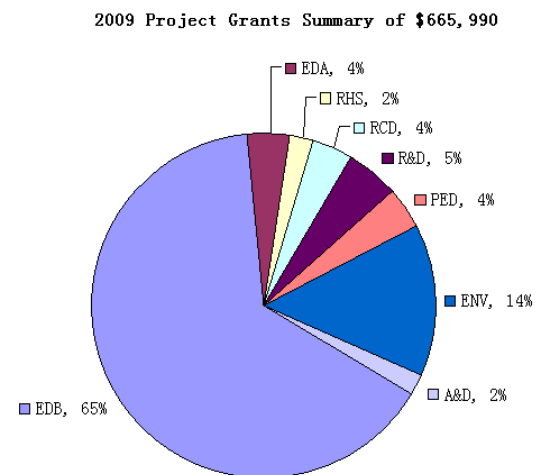

Total project grants to China in 2009 were \$665,990. Education remains our main stay in 2009, accounting for 65% of total project grants.

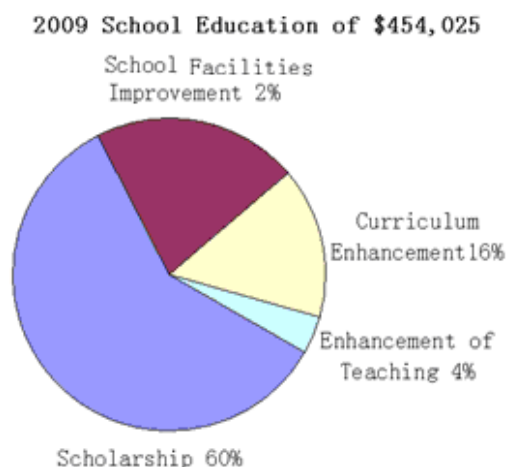

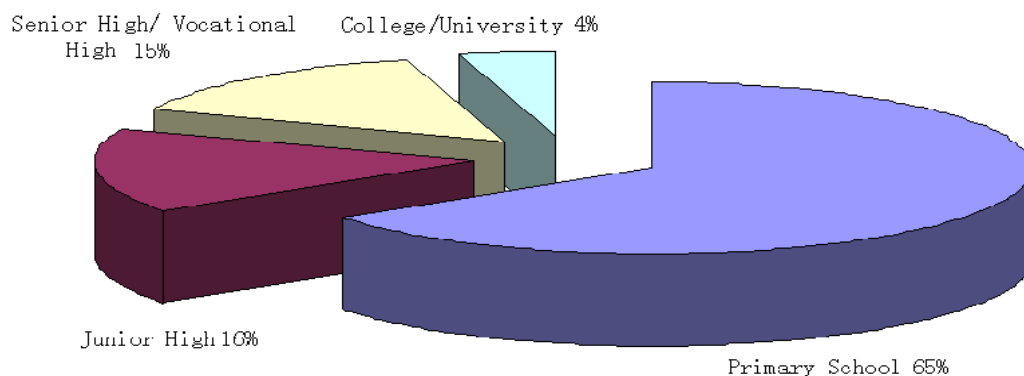
IV. Scholarship Breakdown by Type of School

Because of the increased cost of supporting per student, while the total scholarship amount decreased from \$290,414 to \$260,708, the total number of students receiving financial aid decreased from 3,440 to 2,770. However, this drop does not reflect the increased need for financial aids in the impoverished remote and mountainous areas.

As the central government enforces free compulsory education up to junior high school, Zigen continued to allocate more resources to support more post junior high school education.

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亲爱的滋根朋友：

从 1988 到 2009，20 多年来，参与滋根的人、滋根资助的人及滋根基金会共同经历着激动人心的成长和变化。

20 多年前，住在苗岭深山的李雪花，得到滋根助学金，14 岁才上小学一年级。初中毕业后，在村里成立妇女绣花小组。妇女们聚在一起一面绣花，一面分享自己的痛苦和欢乐，一面分享对改善生活和家乡的梦想。她们在村中组织文艺活动，帮助特别困难的家庭，解决生活急需，处理家庭暴力，逐渐在村中获得了男女平等的地位。12 岁上小学一年级的杨艳英，28 岁师专毕业后，成了村里的第一个女老师。


2003 年，中国公布实行 9 年免费教育，孩子上学不用再交书费、学费，但是中国同时实行“撤点并校”政策，关闭了许多村附近的学校，集中在乡中心校。中心校离家很远，有的需要走数小时才能到中心校，只能住校。许多中心校，住宿条件极差，食物营养不足，缺乏家庭关爱，严重影响了孩子生理和心理的成长。因为到中心校增加的交通费，吃住费用远远超过了贫困家庭的能力，以致许多特困生不能完成 9 年义务教育。滋根近年来，重点支持特困生生活津贴、学校营养加餐及改善住宿条件。

20 多年来，滋根在中国 9 个省的 200 多个乡村支持教育、卫生等项目，成立了长期的合作关系。近年来更重点在 25 个村校支持“一村一校”，即以学校为中心、以村为单位、村校结合的试点专案。在学校首先改善最基本需要，如特困生生活补助，改善学校及住宿条件；提高教学品质：如乡土文化、环境、卫生课程进课堂；在村里改善基本医疗卫生，推广环保技术，通过远程教育加强村民农业科技、卫生、环境认识和知识；特别注重妇女的需要，开展妇女生育健康、妇女权益教育。为了做好“一村一校”的试点，滋根加强了事先调查，设立支持方案，总结经验效果。在这过程中，充分发挥了当地的参与。

中国越来越多的年轻人有志于农村教育和乡村发展事业，但苦于没有管道。滋根专案的内容更广、更深入，也需要全职的工作人员。山西的联络员刘磊，22 岁从中国农业大学毕业后，在黄土高原的石楼，做了一年的志愿者，现在是滋根在山西的全职项目联络员。李光对，从安徽师范学院毕业后，到贵州最偏远的一个小小学，义务支教 4 年，现在河北青龙山区全职工作。他们将青春岁月，全力投入到这些偏远山区，走村串寨，调查了解村民的需要，设计支援专案，跟踪支援的效果，滋根为他们提供了从事乡村教育与发展的管道。消除贫困，保证基本需要，任重道远。
